Everyone matters at AMS

Every member of our community makes a unique contribution to the life of our school. We work hard to ensure that all children recognise their own individual strengths and talents.

All students are members of a tutor group. Led by their tutor, the group meets for a daily registration period. The tutor provides academic guidance and pastoral support and the tutor group forms part of an essential network of friends during your child's time at school. Tutor groups are organised into houses, each led by a Head of House and an Assistant Head of House. Students' excellence, achievement or demonstration of community spirit earns them praise points for themselves and their house, with all students striving to help their house win the House Cup. Through a wide range of Inter House activities and competitions, students have regular opportunities to represent their house, building confidence and experiencing the opportunity to have their areas of strength and excellence celebrated.

Your child's experience of school extends beyond the classroom and as a community, we value highly the benefits of a varied range of extra curricular opportunities. This ranges through summer school, music, drama, CCF, many different sports, public speaking, STEM challenges and many more.

Creativity is nurtured in Ash Manor School. Students develop their creative talents through regular participation in art, music, dance and drama clubs. Large numbers of students take the opportunity to challenge themselves with the Duke of Edinburgh Award programme which is now a well-established feature of school life. We are also very proud to be one of a very small number of state schools with its own Combined Cadet Force.

RESILIENCE

Building resilience for successful futures

Right from their first day, we set ambitious targets for our students. From the moment we speak to their Year 6 teachers, we are working towards their successful futures. A carefully designed curriculum, combining rich academic, creative and practical experiences is underpinned by our strong pastoral support system.

Our comprehensive transition programme is designed to ensure students feel comfortable and excited about the next step in their education. We ensure staff visit our feeder primary schools and offer students the opportunity to spend a morning at Ash Manor School. Later in the year students are able to experience secondary school life first hand with two transition days and a full week of summer school. Throughout these events our Student Senior Leadership Team support our new students, laying the foundations for them to develop the resilience and confidence they need to flourish from their first day in September.

The relationship that we have with families is critical in ensuring that students develop both academically and emotionally, and our pastoral teams are a key point of contact to discuss students' progress and well being. We share information about how your child is progressing at key points throughout the year and welcome parents to our many performances and celebration events.

EXCELLENCE

Aiming for excellence in all that we do

We are clear in our vision that every child should leave Ash Manor School equipped with results that enable them to realise the full range of their ambitions and goals. The journey to realising this begins from the very start of their time with us.

Students are taught by specialists in well-equipped classrooms and specialist teaching rooms. Teaching staff are committed to their ongoing professional development and work hard to ensure lessons make use of new educational research, as well as building on successful strategies for learning and teaching. Teaching staff work collaboratively to explore new approaches to delivering an engaging and inspiring curriculum. Teaching staff are well supported by Progress Coaches who provide support for students with specific learning needs and help to ensure that all students have the opportunities and support they need in order to excel.

In Years 7 and 8 students study a wide and varied range of subjects in order to develop a solid foundation of skills. In Year 9 our students begin to personalise their learning by making their first set of subject choices. This Foundation Year enables students to begin to explore a smaller number of subjects in greater depth in readiness for making final GCSE Option choices for Year 10. All students and families are supported in making these choices through a programme of tutor time activities and our Options Evening. We are passionate about ensuring that every child has the opportunity to study a GCSE curriculum that builds on their learning in Years 7, 8 and 9, giving them the opportunity to realise their potential for excellence in Years 10 and 11.

An active, independent, respectful community
